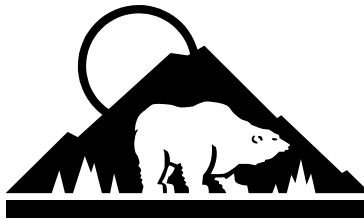

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## INTRODUCTION

This is a list of all National Archives microfilm publications and other microfilm titles which are held by the National Archives and Records Administration - Pacific Alaska Region (Anchorage). Copies of this list are available at our office.

Hours. Our office is open weekdays, 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., except for Federal holidays. We are also open the first Saturday of each month, 8:00 a.m. - 4:00 p.m., except Federal holidays (researchers are advised to contact the archives in advance of their visit to confirm open Saturdays).

Microfilm Research Room. The microfilm publications which appear in this list are located in the microfilm research room (Cabinets 1-42, 47-52, 55-64), adjoining storage (Cabinets 43-46 and 53-64), and in off-site storage (see storage box number). The microfilm cabinets are marked by cabinet number (1 through 64), then by the drawers (1 through 12) in each cabinet, which correspond to the numbers given in this list for each microfilm. The cabinet numbers are in the upper-right hand corner of each cabinet. Cabinet 1 is at the far left on the back wall of the microfilm research room. Cabinets 1-31 hold only the Federal population censuses (1790-1920); the census soundex indexes for 1880-1930; the 1890 Special Census of Union Veterans and Widows; and the *City Directories of the United States, 1902-1935*. Cabinets 48-52 contain the 1930 federal population census and soundex indexes. The microfilm research room is a self-service system. There is a microfilm reader-printer available for use by researchers. There is a charge of \$0.30 per page for self-service microfilm-to-paper copies.

Census Index Books, Microfilm Catalogs, and Other Finding Aids. The Federal population census has been taken every ten years beginning in 1790, but census schedules less than 72 years old are not open to the public. This office holds schedules from 1790 to 1930. For the years 1790-1870, head-of-household surnames are listed alphabetically in the census index books. We hold most, not all, years and states of these guides. From 1880 to 1930, researchers can use the microfilm "soundex" index to surnames. The 1890 census was destroyed by fire and only fragments exist. There are separate census microfilm catalogs for 1790 through 1890, 1900, 1910, 1920, and 1930 in the microfilm research room to guide researchers into the film. These catalogs index the film by year, state, county, and for the largest cities, enumeration district. This office also has available other National Archives catalogs for non-census microfilm, descriptive pamphlets for the M-numbered microfilm publications, and other guides to NARA holdings. Please ask the staff for help in identifying rolls you need. Our staff can also provide copies of census matrix forms and National Archives Trust Fund forms for ordering copies of passenger arrival lists, federal census records, Eastern Cherokee applications, land entry records, and veterans' military service, bounty land warrant, and pension files. There are two Public Access Computer (PAC) terminals in the Microfilm Research Room which can be used to access census indexes and other databases on *Ancestry Plus* (a fee-for-subscription service available to researchers without charge), *Biography & Genealogy Master Index*, *Biography Resource Center* + *The Complete Marquis Who's Who*, and the *History Resource Center: U.S.*

Microfilm publications for which descriptive pamphlets have been prepared are indicated on this list by the symbol (DP). These pamphlets include an introduction to the publication, indexes or lists, and roll-by-roll descriptions. Descriptive pamphlets are also reproduced at the beginning of Roll 1 in most "M" numbered publications.

Microfilm in Storage. Microfilm rolls in cabinets 43-46 and 53-54 are not in the microfilm research room; rolls must be requested from our staff. Microfilm publications in storage are identified with a storage box number and also must be requested from the staff.

National Archives Gift Fund. NARA's Pacific Alaska Region (Anchorage) does not have many of the National Archives microfilm publications. If you have bought film for your research, and wish to add it to the collection when your primary use is over, donations are gratefully accepted. There is a gift fund for which we also gratefully accept donations to buy microfilm.

Volunteer Program. We seek volunteers who have an interest in American history, archives, genealogy, or the National Archives and Records Administration itself and its programs. Volunteers donate their time and talents and assist the staff in performing reference or other archival project services. Alternate Sources to National Archives Microfilm Publications. Genealogical microfilm owned by NARA's Pacific Alaska Region (Anchorage) cannot be borrowed. Those National Archives microfilm publications not available here can be located through several other sources, including the Family History Library in Salt Lake City, Utah, or one of its Family History Libraries (1-800-346-6044). There is a Family History Library in Anchorage. Microfilm may also be available through interlibrary loan at your local library. The National Archives Microfilm Rental Program also has available a limited selection of National Archives microfilm publications (P.O. Box 30, Annapolis Junction, MD 20701-0030 [telephone: 301-604-3699]; [www.archives.gov](http://www.archives.gov)).

How to Purchase Microfilm. All microfilm publications of National Archives records are for sale. You can buy individual rolls from the National Archives Trust Fund (\$34/roll, domestic orders; \$39/roll, foreign orders, including shipping). These prices are subject to change without notice.
